VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL

Pastor Anne Is Authorized, Fully Licensed to Serve Collbran

As I celebrate six months with our Collbran Congregational, United Church of Christ Church family and community, I would like to share glad news that I have completed all the requirements for Fully Authorized, Licensed Lay Ministry. Provisional Licensure was provided in January, 2016. Since that time I have completed a second Boundary Training (at the Rocky Mountain Conference UCC Annual Meeting in Salt Lake City; June, 2016).

The Western Association and Rocky Mountain Conference require a psychological evaluation as do most, if not all, denominations in the United States. I completed this process in July, 2016. The final step to the Licensed Lay Minister designation was a meeting with the Church and Ministry committee. This was a meeting of several Western Slope representatives from Eagle, Haydn, and Montrose held in Grand Junction on July 30. At this meeting a vote was unanimously passed to move me from provisional to fully authorized license lay minister in order to serve Collbran Congregational UCC Church. This licensure is active for one year. I will meet annually with this committee to remain licensed and current in my position. Thank you for all your support in this process!
