

Dear Family and Friends of Collbran Congregational United Church of Christ,

Thanksgiving, Advent, and now Christmas have brought love, joy, and fellowship to our congregation, church family, and all the community!

During November my sermons were woven together by the theme: "What's in Your Cornucopia?" We explored scriptures from Philippians, Ephesians, Psalms, and Luke. Sermon topics were: <u>No Matter What, Be Thankful; The Benefits of a</u> <u>Grateful Heart; A Lesson from the One Leper; and Fill Your Cornucopia with Five Keys to Giving Thanks</u>. Our Adult/Teen Sunday school Class studied Philip Yancy's book <u>The Jesus I Never Knew</u>. The Children's Messages included: "What's in Your Cornucopia?", "Ordinary Mary's Extraordinary Deed", "Giving Thanks", and "Psalm 100: A Good One to Know."
