Message from Pastor Anne, March 2019

Welcome Lent! Lent begins officially on March 6, 2019 this year. In 2017 Collbran Congregational, United Church of Christ started a new tradition in which we observe Ash Wednesday on the *Sunday before* Ash Wednesday. Our Ash Wednesday Observance this year will be on Sunday, March 3 during our regular Sunday morning worship service. All are welcome! The brief service for Ash Wednesday includes an Introduction and Greeting, Scripture Reading, Invitation to the Observance of Lenten Discipline, Thanksgiving over the Ashes, the Imposition of Ashes on the forehead or the back of the hand, closing with the singing of a hymn. It is very meaningful and accessible to the entire congregation including our children and youth. The imposition of ashes has become a beautiful part of Congregational, United Church of Christ Church congregations throughout the United States and Canada.

As Lent begins, we pray that God will "create and make in us new and contrite hearts." This season of Lent we are invited to prepare our hearts and lives for renewal. Our hearts are the ground from which spring our thoughts, our actions, our choices, and our words. Therefore, it is a right, good, and joyful choice that we practice some "cleaning, pruning, and general shaping up" of our spiritual lives as we approach Holy Week and Easter.

On Sunday, March 10 and throughout Lent, our Adult/Teen Sunday school class will resume meeting every Sunday at 9:45 - 10:30 AM to study and have conversation guided by the United Church of Christ Lenten booklet. All are welcome to join the class and Pastor Anne on this journey. It will be a joyful sharing of ideas and promises to be very enlightening and valuable for us. Come as often as you can! ANNUAL MEETING REPORT

The meeting was called to order by Moderator Julia Cox at 1:00 pm, following a delicious potluck lunch, made even better with good company.

Pastor Anne offered a blessing to start the meeting. We are thankful to have 11 children in church today!

25 people were in attendance. 16 were members so a quorum was me. A quorum is 30% of our 35 members or 11 people.

The agenda was approved for the meeting and the minutes from Jan 2018 read and approved.

Clerk's Report: Monica presented the report for 2018. We are very thankful for the addition of many new members!

Pastor's Report: Anne noted all the things she has been a part of in the past year. She accomplished so many good things. She noted that she made a total of 95 visits and 152

phone calls to church members and friends in 2018. This is a wonderful mission because those people greatly appreciate this extra attention and care. We greatly appreciate this because many of the folks are in Grand Junction and it is tougher for other congregants to get to see them. Anne said she is thankful for the increase in attendance and for all the work that was done in the past year. As of March, she will have been with us for three years. We are so thankful for that Pastor Anne and Sveto! You have brought new life to our church!

Moderator's Report: Julia gave her report. She said that it has been a good year and thanked everyone who helps keep the church up and running.

Treasurer's Report: Sue was unable to attend so Julia and Cindy gave the Treasurer's Report. Cindy pointed out that the \$247,000 in savings with the UC Fund is a gift that was given to help us in times of need. It is to help us through tough times but needs to be kept intact to keep the church running. Sue is very diligent to keep returning money used to this fund. We thank Sue for her good management of the church's finances! Cindy noted all the gifts given for the Noisy Offerings in 2018. It's amazing that so many missions are provided for. Julia noted that the Noisy Offering recipients will be the same in 2019 unless someone has another fund they'd like to consider.

Stewardship Report: Cyndi Leinberger gave the Stewardship Report. This committee (including Cindy Price and Shannon Murphy) prepared a letter, and sent it out in mid-December, to the church and community asking for contributions for all the different uses of our church. \$2300 has been received so far, as a result of that letter.

Steward's Report: Jeannie gave the Stewards report. The Stewards do an awesome job at keeping things running smoothly at the church, including communion, lighting candles, greeting people, assisting with collecting offering, etc. They also help line up help to provide food for fellowship time after services as well as for special events. They order and purchase poinsettias for Christmas, lilies at Easter, and palms for Palm Sunday. Without them, things would not go well at all! Julia thanked the Stewards for taking care of all these things with a smile or joke from Jeannie and with the steadfastness of Jean and Sylvia and Peggy Shiflet.

Trustee's Report: Cindy gave the Trustees report. The Trustees worked so hard to keep things running at the church this year and with completing repairs necessary at the Parsonage for its sale. Now that the parsonage is sold, it relieves some of the pressure in upkeep and maintenance but as with any old building, there is always something needed on the church! Julia, Cindy, Sue, and Nancy help keep things running smoothly. They also get some help from Sveto Djokic, Rory White, Becky Schowalter, and others, including, Norm McCallister, Brett Murphy, Tom Cox, Tom Bieser, and Larry Bellotti. Nancy noted how important it is that we realize how much work Delbert Kuehn does for us also. He takes

care of more than just snow shoveling and mowing. He keeps an eye on things and lets folks know of problems. Becky Schowalter does the same. She does more work than her contract requires.

Music Report: Sue Bellotti, Charli Gaddy, and Pastor Anne are our three talented musicians. Without them, our services would be a lot less lively and beautiful! Thank you for your beautiful music.

Christian Education: Sue got Vacation Bible School lined out before she left on a trip. Then, Julia, Cindy, Anne, and others pulled it off and made a fun few days of summer for area children. 55 people attended the Sunday following VBS! Sue continues to teach Sunday School with the help of Julia and others. Pastor Anne had several studies for the adults. Cyndi offered to teach a middle school class for VBS next year.

Women's Fellowship: Everyone missed Nancy while she was gone this summer. Women's Fellowship helps so many people. It's amazing all the good things that are done by a small group of people. They list a whole page of missions they supported this past year. That's in

New Business: New contracts were issued to Anne, Delbert, and Becky for 2019. Their salaries were increased. A request was made for ideas/needs from the congregation. Nothing was noted at the time but folks are free to contribute their thoughts. One concern is about the drainage on the west side of the church. We will have to prioritize getting this work completed in the spring.

Some exciting news is that our membership is growing! Anne's visitation with folks, participation in events, etc. is helping grow our congregation.

The meeting adjourned at 1:55 pm with the assistance of Marshall and Hazel Jennings.
