# Pastor Anne's Message, October 2020

Dear Family and Friends of Collbran Congregational Church, U.C.C.,

I hope this message finds you healthy and well, enjoying the gorgeous autumn colors ~ yellow and gold; red, orange, and shades of brown in the ground cover. When not hazy or smoky, the bright, blue fall skies of western Colorado make for great photography. I took over 125 pictures in just 5 hours!! Sveto and I drove over the Grand Mesa starting in Collbran on Monday, September 28th. We packed a picnic lunch and headed south toward Bonham Reservoir. Near Twin Peaks Bible Camp, I hopped out of our vehicle to take pictures of a particularly radiant stand of aspen trees. From around a corner, four cattle lumbered down the hill making their way single file! I don't believe they noticed us.

Since March and our new routines with stay-at-home weeks and months, I have discovered several advantages to slowing down my usual hustle and bustle. We have done more cooking which takes a little extra preparation time. At the Cross Orchards Farmer's Market, I bought green and red peppers which I

stuffed with meat, cheese, Spanish rice, and fresh tomatoes ~ once a week! Although peaches were at a premium and hard to find this summer, we managed to make several peach pies.

We have been worshipping in person in our sanctuary for all of June, July, August, September, and now well into October. ### **Trustees' Report October 2020**

The Trustees have been busy. There have been meetings with an architect to plan renovations in the basement for a more handicap accessible bathroom. There will be some new doors, walls moved, and general upgrades to make this happen.

The lawns have been well cared for by Delbert Koehn and our housekeeper, Becky Schowalter, keeps the building clean. We appreciate all these two do for the church.

The sprinkler system has been blown out and readied for winter.

The dirt pile behind the kitchen has been spread out and the pit liner lain down to try to prevent water from settling against the basement wall. With no rain we have not had a trial run to see if we are making headway at keeping water from running from the large roof of the gym down along the foundation.

There will be some upgrades in the main floor with window shades for the nursery and pastor's office as well as a more usable desk in the pastor's office.



Cleaning cabinets and bookshelves has been taking place when time is available. The Salvation Army in Grand Junction was happy to accept four boxes of Bibles that had accumulated on the office shelves and in the classrooms. There is an interesting collection of older hymnals we kept, just for reference and pleasure. The craft cabinets have been sorted and much of the supplies gathered into totes to use with Vacation Bible School.

The big project of cleaning and rearranging the room in the basement known as the Old Library or, more currently, the 4-H Room, will begin to take place this week. We hope to be able to eliminate the clutter and overcrowding that has happened over the years. Cattlewomen, Lions Club, and the 4-H have used this room for storage for many years. The 4-H also holds some meetings and classes in this space.

A list has been created and a local contractor will be contacted

to begin making the repairs around the building. As everyone knows a building big or small requires regular maintenance. Especially when it is 117 years old.

A video surveillance system has been installed both inside and outside of the building. After a couple of rather dangerous incidences this past summer we felt it was time to come into the tech age. We are having problems with bikes, skateboards, and scooters being ridden in the park and causing damage to the basement door at the ramp. We hope to get signage up again to let everyone know these rules.

CDOT has built new ADA ramps onto the sidewalk from High Street. We do appreciate this upgrade. The broken cement and rough surface that was replaced was a concern. Thank you, CDOT for making this possible.

The stained glass window repairs and maintenance has been set for December 2020. If the weather or company work schedule does not work out the project will be pushed out to the spring of 2021.
