Pastor Anne's Message, September 2021

Welcome September! Our preschool, elementary, middle, high school, home school students of all ages, and college students are back in the classrooms and on campuses; or soon to return to universities, new jobs and adventures, explorations, journeys, and new beginnings! This is what I think of as we move out of "summer mode" to "The Fall."



The IALAC Story is told to illustrate how one's self-concept can be damaged and destroyed by others. Take a sheet of paper and write the letters IALAC on it in bold print. (Pronounced "I-ah-lack.") Holding it to your chest so that the children can see it, tell them "Everyone carries an invisible IALAC sign around with them at all times and wherever they go. IALAC stands for 'I Am Lovable and Capable.' This is our self-concept, or how we feel about ourselves. If somebody is nasty to us, teases us, puts us down, rejects us, hits us, etc. ...then a piece of our IALAC sign is torn away."

Here is a great illustration one can do with kids. Make a sign for yourself and tape it to the front of your shirt. Tell a story like this: "A 7th grade boy named Buddy is still lying in bed three minutes after his alarm goes off. His mother calls to him, "Buddy, you lazy head, get your body out of that bed and down here for breakfast!" (RIP!) Tear a piece of the paper off from your IALAC sign. When he can't find his socks, mom says, "wear yesterday's pair." (RIP!) Buddy's sister is hogging the bathroom and he skips brushing his teeth. (RIP!) As he leaves for school, he forgets his lunch and his homework, and then misses the bus! (RIP! RIP! RIP!) Arriving late, he has to get a pass from the principal who gives him a lecture. (RIP!) Now, you can think of many more examples of little and bigger things which would tear one's IALAC sign to bits!! The bullies in the halls, on the playgrounds, in the lunchroom, in town. Move along and end your story with Buddy ending the day and going to bed with his personal IALAC ("I Am Lovable and Capable") sign the size of a quarter!! Not good.

Now...this is the best part. How can you and the children rebuild the torn IALAC sign? By sincere compliments and "lifting up" the downtrodden person. Children love giving uplifting comments to you as you retape the torn pieces, until you have a (rough looking) but reassembled, intact IALAC sign.

Specific, positive compliments and encouragement to our children (especially) are invaluable to supporting and building up individuals who someday will be adults. Confident, well-adjusted, and happy adults, likely received steady love and attention as youngsters; thereby, maintaining their IALAC Signs of childhood and youth...to adulthood.

Let's all reach out to one another ~ children, youth, AND adults as we strive to buildup and maintain the IALAC Signs of each individual. You are a beloved child of God. Remember that!


We will be looking for bids from local contractors for a new sign for the south lawn of the church. As soon as dimensions and the description are determined we will publish the request for bids.


Call to action to help the people of Haiti.

A massive 7.2 earthquake on Saturday has killed nearly 1,300 people. Search and rescue efforts are expected to be hampered by Tropical Depression Grace, which came ashore on Monday. These dual natural disasters struck just over a month after Haiti's president was shot to death at home, sending the country into political chaos.

The UCC appeal hopes to raise \$100,000 to assist the people of Haiti through this crisis.
