Dear Family and Friends of Collbran Congregational Church,

The first day of Spring, 2022 is only twenty days away as I write this message. In our backyard, daffodil and tulip greenery is popping up through the snow of last week in Grand Junction. I have always lived in states (Massachusetts, New Hampshire, Michigan, Kansas, Wyoming, and Colorado) where there were four distinctive seasons, and I have always enjoyed each season!

Of all the church celebrations and holidays on the calendar, my mother Priscilla loved Easter the best! My mother was "all about" the Resurrection of Jesus Christ and Eternal Life. Now that I have been a mother myself for 25+ years, I would agree with the importance of Easter \sim in addition to noting that the preparations for an Easter Day celebration are definitely "lighter" and less involved than what I choose to do surrounding Christmas.

But seriously folks, when you stop and ponder the Season of Lent, the preparation time and Journey of Lent is quite an expedition and process in and of itself! This is in imitation of Jesus Christ's fasting in the wilderness before he began his public ministry. These 40 days are set aside to praise and worship the Lord to anticipate deeper closeness with God.



With that said, I encourage you and your families to consider spending some quality time in your approach to Lent and the coming of Easter on April 17, 2022! All are invited and welcomed to join our Sunday morning worship service at 11:00 AM in our sanctuary, followed by fellowship and light refreshments after the service. There are many devotional books and guides available at bookstores and on-line. Lent is a time to treat yourself to reading portions of the Bible, either favorite scriptures or new ones. Reaching out to the community and doing more for your family or friends are also ways to experience giving of yourself for others who may be lonely, need a hand with childcare or simple errands, or just a cup of tea and conversation on the phone or at your kitchen table.

The overhead TV screen can accommodate a power point viewing, and simple refreshments can be served from the new counter. Trustees manage the rent and outside use of the building. The Collbran Congregational Church Community Building is your center for events, celebrations, family activities, and meetings. We love partnering with you to serve our community.

We appreciate your past support and donations which have helped us maintain and make improvements to the community building.

The building has been open as of June 2020 for church services, building use, baptisms, weddings, funerals, Vacation Bible School and Christmas Eve Service. Monthly Noisy Offerings support non-profit organizations in the valley.

Woman's Fellowship provides the Annual Thanksgiving Dinner, funeral luncheons, and maintains the Food Bank.



Dance and tumbling and yoga classes, family events, meetings of groups such as 4-H, Collbran Lion's Club, Cattlewomen, and Horizon Club frequently use the building. Farmer's Market and Collbran Branch Library regularly use Mother's Park. The playground equipment is enjoyed by children and families who use the park for parties and picnics.

This is an awkward time to present a Treasurer's Report as the year has just begun and it is not a full quarter, but I am happy to present some financial information.

In January, there were repairs in the amount of \$2093 to the boiler. There were substantial repairs made following an inspection by the State Boiler Inspector. While the plumber was onsite, he made a repair that had been put off for some time.

There have been additional expenditures of \$514.10 by the Safety Committee for proper EXIT signs, smoke detectors, and fire extinguishers. Nearly all have been installed.


Memorial Committee Report


Ann was a longtime member of the Collbran Congregational Church, with centennial family history of raising sheep and cattle in the Plateau Valley.
