Karen Armstrong is a British author who wrote A HISTORY OF GOD: THE 4,000-YEAR QUEST OF JUDAISM, CHRISTIANITY AND ISLAM. Her work focuses on commonalities of the major religions, such as the importance of compassion and the Golden Rule. As one of the foremost commentators on religious affairs, she has said of our current situation, "Fundamentalism is now part of the modern world...." "It represents disappointment, alienation, and anxiety."

Islamic fundamentalists seem to operate with closed minds and clenched fists, seeing themselves in a holy war against America. And looking deeply at the post-9/11 mood in the United States, we see that it has morphed into hatred and prejudice against persons who are different than "us," especially, Muslims. In both brands of fundamentalism, there has been a hardening of the hearts of zealots who believe in the righteousness of their cause and who are willing to do anything it takes to win the war against their enemies.

In any dialogue we have with those with different perspectives we need an open mind and a softened heart. Jesus said to his disciples, "See, I am

sending you out like sheep into the midst of wolves; so be wise as serpents and innocent as doves."

55 years ago this month, Martin Luther King, Jr. reframed Jesus' words to reflect the need for non-violent dialogue across the racial divide. He said:

"So Jesus reminds in a striking way that the good life demands combining the toughness of the serpent with the tenderness of the dove. To have serpent-like qualities devoid of dove-like qualities is to be passionless, mean and selfish. To have dove-like qualities without serpent-like qualities is to be sentimental, aimless, and empty. We must combine in our characters [these] antitheses."

He goes on to describe how these qualities are rooted in the very nature of God:

"The greatness of our God lies in the fact that he is both tough minded and tender hearted. This tough-mindedness of God is expressed in an austere masculinity. The tender-heartedness of God is expressed in a gentle femininity.... The Bible stresses both the tough mindedness of God – His justice and Wrath – and the tender-heartedness of God – his love and grace. God has two strong arms-one that is strong enough to surround us with justice and one that is gentle enough to surround us with grace."

These spiritual faculties are in short-supply in our very polarized and confrontational society/world where so many people still divide the world into good and bad people. Mira Nair disabuses us of that bad habit and points the way to other options in her profound film-adaptation of Mohsin Hamid's novel, THE RELUCTANT FUNDAMENTALIST. It is a riveting depiction of extremism in our world and the global danger it poses for all of us. (If you were unable to view the film with us on Sunday evening, August 24th, I am willing to make the DVD available for you to watch at home.)

Elsewhere in the Mustard Seed, I have included a copy of the CHARTER FOR COMPASSION, which Karen Armstrong proposed in her TED Talk, February, 2008.

THE TEXT OF THE CHARTER FOR COMPASSION

The principle of compassion lies at the heart of all religious, ethical and spiritual traditions, calling us always to treat all others as we wish to be treated ourselves. Compassion impels us to work tirelessly to alleviate the suffering of our fellow creatures, to dethrone ourselves from the center of our world and put another there, and to honor the inviolable sanctity of every single human being, treating everybody, without exception, with absolute justice, equity and respect.

It is also necessary in both public and private life to refrain consistently and empathically from inflicting pain. To act or speak violently out of spite, chauvinism, or self-interest, to impoverish, exploit or deny basic rights to anybody, and to incite hatred by denigrating others—even our enemies—is a denial of our common humanity. We acknowledge that we have failed to live compassionately and that some have even increased the sum of human misery in the name of religion.

We therefore call upon all men and women to restore compassion to the center of morality and religion ~ to return to the ancient principle that any interpretation of scripture that breeds violence, hatred or disdain is illegitimate ~ to ensure that youth are given accurate and respectful information about other traditions, religions and cultures ~ to encourage a positive appreciation of cultural and religious diversity ~ to cultivate an informed empathy with the suffering of all human beings—even those regarded as enemies.

We urgently need to make compassion a clear, luminous and dynamic force in our polarized world. Rooted in a principled determination to transcend selfishness, compassion can break down political, dogmatic, ideological and religious boundaries. Born of our deep interdependence, compassion is essential to human relationships and to a fulfilled humanity. It is the path to enlightenment, and indispensable to the creation of a just economy and a peaceful global community

"Many thanks for your prayers. I hope you continue to pray for me since I am staying longer this trip. During my time here, I'll finish work on the Zarma.net website. I hope to make it more user friendly to people in this country. I'm also converting Bible-based resource for use with cell phones. A growing percent of the people here own a cell phone or have access to one. These are feature phones that in addition to making calls, have the capacity to play digital audio files such as theatrical productions recorded by the Messengers of Christ acting troupe. They can view on a small screen such videos as THE JESUS FILM, Material that Partnership Niger has helped over the years that will reach a much larger audience when they can be viewed on on these feature phones.

Leaders at the Mobile Ministry Forom have developed an online course teaching practical skills for using cell phones as evangelistic tools. As I complete this study, I'll be able to apply the information to our situation in this part of the world. I look forward to learning how to use the mobile technogoly to reach even more people with Gospel message."
