10 C.S. LEWIS QUOTES THAT SHOW HE WAS AHEAD OF HIS TIME

Fifty years ago on November 22, C.S. Lewis quietly passed away in his home. His death went widely unnoticed, as JFK was assassinated on the same day (*Brave New World* author Aldous Huxley also died, making November 22, 1963 a truly lamentable day in recent human history), but it left a void that has never been rightly filled.

To whom is there to compare him? He was not a trained theologian (as many trained theologians will hasten to say) nor was he ever ordained. In his lifetime, he was a professor, literary critic and essayist. His dear friend J.R.R. Tolkien said he modeled Treebeard after Lewis. He is best remembered now as a children's author. But none of those come close to encompassing the unique place Lewis holds in modern Christianity. As an excellent profile in <u>Christianity Today</u> argues, he might be best described as a poet. Someone with a rare gift to channel his mighty intellect and generous spirit through an artful, unparalleled mix of wit, warmth and spectacular clarity.

Like many people, I owe a good deal in my own life to Lewis. The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe is the first book I remember reading. When I was little, I wanted to change my name to Peter. I have a lamppost tattooed on my arm. As I've grown up, my appreciation of his works has matured as well.*Till We Have Faces* remains, in my mind, one of the English language's finest novels. Most people reading this could tell their own stories. He has that effect on people.

There are more imaginative authors. There are better theologians. But "Jack," as he was known to friends, stands alone in his ability to convey theology through joyous, glorious art. It's argument, rhetoric and debate wrapped in delightful prose and storytelling. It's the sort of writing where the felicity of thought seems directly tied to the writer's skill. And so progressive was Lewis' thinking—so ahead of his time (although he'd most certainly argue that he was old-fashioned)—that his writing seems endlessly applicable for each generation since his passing. Every generation seems to revere him anew, because every generation has much to learn from him.

Here at RELEVANT, we'll have a few pieces on the life and work of Lewis over the next week to commemorate his continuing legacy. There is no substitute for reading everything Lewis ever wrote (he preferred his fiction to his apologetics, though both make for fine reading) but for those who aren't initiated and those who are, here are a few choice quotes:

MERE CHRISTIANITY

We all want progress, but if you're on the wrong road, progress means doing an about-turn and walking back to the right road; in that case, the man who turns back soonest is the most progressive.

GOD IN THE DOCK

One must keep on pointing out that Christianity is a statement which, if false, is of no importance, and, if true, of infinite importance. The one thing it cannot be is moderately important.

BLUSPELS AND FLALANSFERES: A SEMANTIC NIGHTMARE

Reason is the natural organ of truth; but imagination is the organ of meaning.

THE FOUR LOVES

To love at all is to be vulnerable. Love anything and your heart will be wrung and possibly broken. If you want to make sure of keeping it intact you must give it to no one, not even an <u>animal</u>². Wrap it carefully round with hobbies and little luxuries; avoid all entanglements. Lock it up safe in the casket or coffin of your selfishness. But in that casket, safe, dark, motionless, airless, it will change. It will not be broken; it will become unbreakable, impenetrable, irredeemable. To love is to be vulnerable.

A speech by Gary Winkleblack

Paving Tribute

It was six years ago that I stood before 300 of my fellow Soldiers and United States Army Corps of Engineer civilians in a U.S. Army compound in Kabul, Afghanistan. My purpose then, as it is now was to pay tribute to the over 3000 police, firemen, EMTs, military and civilian personnel that were killed in a ruthless, senseless, cowardly, and barbaric attacks 13 years ago. Each of the casualties of the 9/11 attack was robbed of another day, another week, or perhaps years of all the possibilities that life has to offer.

Today, as we pay tribute to the memories of the victims of 9/11, we should also open our hearts to their friends and families who have been left to pick up the pieces of this tragic event and try to make sense of it all, in their sorrow and grief. On 9/11, 3051 children lost one or both of their parents.

As I sat in Afghanistan six years ago, the recognition of the horrible events that took place on that memorable day, took on a more personal and relative meaning, a meaning that will remain with me the rest of my life.

We Americans, who live in a free society, must not take our freedoms and liberties for granted. We must not forget that "freedom is not free" and each of us has a responsibility to our society and to world peace to combat and prevent terrorism in any way we can.

Afghanistan and Terrorism

In Afghanistan women and young girls are brutally beaten or executed because they choose to attend school, or go out in public unattended by their fathers, husbands, or a male relative, or show their face in public, or because they fail to be totally subservient to their fathers, husbands, and men in general.

Terrorists will strap bombs on the bodies of impressionable, confused and heavily drugged young people and then send them into a crowd of Soldiers or villagers so that they may detonate the bombs, killing or injuring everyone nearby.

Terrorists coerce Afghans working for the Coalition Forces into activities such as planting bombs within the military and civilian compounds or spying on the Coalition Forces to gain intelligence for future attacks. If the Afghan workers fail to cooperate, the terrorists will kill the worker's family members until the workers cooperate.

Afghan terrorists have attacked Coalition Forces from inside mosques, orphanages, and hospitals knowing that Coalition Forces that are ordered to not engage the enemy in these locations would rarely return fire.

Why do I tell you such horror stories? I tell you because you must not forget that terrorists seek to destroy the American way of life by any means possible. If they wreak such havoc and destruction upon their own people, their own women, their own children, they would not hesitate to do the same or worse to others. Terrorists want their people to remain ignorant and uneducated. They want the people to fear them and to follow and execute their horrific plans of death and destruction.

Terrorists do not want to work within the structure of law and order. They do not want to resolve their differences by discussions and negotiations. They do not want their countrymen or tribesmen to seek equality and a better standard of living. Terrorists believe the way to deal with their adversaries is by committing heinous crimes against mankind and forcing their will upon others through extortion, intimidation, subversion and destruction of the heart, the mind, and the will to be free to make personal choices. Terrorists are hoping that because 9/11 took place 13 years ago that the American people will be lulled into thinking acts of terrorism have diminished, but I must remind you all they have not! I can name you numerous international acts of terrorism that have been carried out since 9/11; most recently the execution of two innocent, non-combatant journalists carried out by the terrorists group ISIS!

What Can Americans Do?

You are not powerless in the war to fight terrorism. You can empower yourself to combat terrorism – continue to be educated, no matter your age; learn to resolve conflict through peaceful resolutions; work and live within the framework of public law and order; and always strive for equality and always support the Constitution of the United States. Remember, every chain is only as strong as its weakest link. If we fail to support and strengthen our American way of life, then we're making ourselves more vulnerable to acts of terrorism.

In conclusion, September 11, 2001 is a day we should honor those who lost their lives in the cowardly attacks and to keep in our hearts and minds those friends and family members who have been left behind, remembering the tragic circumstances in which they lost their loved ones. But also, let this day be an eternal reminder to be ever vigilant to combat terrorism and those that would seek to destroy our American culture and way of life. Thank you.
