

#### **Annual Meeting Minutes**

January 17, 2016

#### Persons Present:

Moderator Julia Cox called the meeting to order at 1:15 pm after a delicious potluck dinner.

Pastor Gary asked for blessing over our meeting and for our church and for God's guidance in the future.

The quorum number was met and approved.

The agenda was reviewed. Cindy Price moved to accept the agenda and Monica Klingler seconded. The motion passed and carried. .

The Annual Meeting Minutes from January 2015 were reviewed. Sylvia moved that the Minutes be accepted as presented. Cindy Price seconded and the motion passed and carried.

Clerk's Report: Monica presented the Clerk's report. One correction was made- we had 25 members.

Pastors Report: Pastor reviewed his 7-1/2 years of interim ministry at our church. He said he has been grateful for that time.

Treasurer's Report: Sue reviewed the Treasurer's Report and discussed the roof repair. We will have to work to repay our loan from the UC Foundation monies for this work. Sue discussed our mission giving that that our church is very generous. We gave \$3931.06 in 2015. Our income for 2015 was \$46,520.15. The Women's Fellowship also donated \$1500 to the church. Actual operating expenses were \$48,777.20. If you add the roof costs, our total expenditures were \$129,242.82 (including the roof). After the fact, we finished the year in the black. Sue then discussed the proposed budget for 2016.

Moderator's Report: Julia summarized the past year. She thanked Nancy, Cindy, Sue, and Pastor for all their work. It takes everyone to keep things going. She also told Anne Djokic that we're all looking forward to working with her.

Stewardship Report: The Stewardship Report was given by Cyndi Leinberger. She said that \$14,390 has been donated for the roof so far.

Trustee's Report: Cindy Price gave the Trustee's Report. The main project in 2015 was the new roof! In addition, the Trustee's prepared a new Custodial Agreement. Everyone thanked Nancy Karlson for her many years of taking on those duties.

**Steward's Report:** Sylvia gave the Steward's Report and told all the activities they have provided for and helped with.

Women's Fellowship: Nancy gave the Women's Fellowship Report. They are trying to help with Gray Gourmet, Senior Tea, and the Turkey Dinner. In 2015, they helped with 5 funeral dinners; paid for the Maundy Thursday meal, the Senior Tea, etc.; and helped with several mission projects to help spread the gospel.

Music Program Report: Sue reported that the organ still needs to be repaired. Her son Aaron will be coming up to check on what is wrong with it. Otherwise, she and Annie just keep on playing!

Christian Education: Sue told about the kids and all they've been learning. They've been studying some different stories than are typically found in a curriculum. Vacation Bible School will be planned for June. Sue thanked Edith Ann for all her help with the kids and teaching. For the adults, Pastor has ordered Lenten devotionals.

**Memorial Committee:** Nancy and Cindy gave the report for the Memorial committee. The balances of the Memorial funds were noted. It is likely that the money in all the funds will be donated towards repaying the UC Foundation for the roof repairs.

Search Committee: Julia said that we will continue working with Sue Artt to have Anne Djokic come as our interim pastor. Anne told us that she was in the process of jumping through all the hoops of the Rocky Mountain Conference to prepare to become our interim pastor.

There is obviously much work that has been done in the past year and much more to do. Sue moved to accept all the reports as given and corrected. Sylvia seconded. The motion passed and carried.

Nominating Committee: Cindy reviewed the Nominating Committee Report with the nominations and all who will be serving in 2016. There are still two open positions for Trustees. No additional nominations were made. Sue moved that we accept the nominations as slated and hope and pray for help with the empty positions. Cyndi Leinberger seconded. The motion passed and carried.

The accepted nominations are as follows: Sylvia Spangler, Moderator; Cindy Price, Moderator-Elect; Julia Cox, Past Moderator; Monica Klingler, Clerk; Sue Bellotti, Treasurer/Christian Education/Music Director; Cyndi Leinberger, Stewardship Chairperson; Nancy Karlson, Women's Fellowship; Ann Anderson and Cindy Price and Nancy Karlson plus 1 OPEN slot, Trustees; Doris Achenbach and Peggy Shiflet and Jean Kees, and Debbie Hamm, Stewards; Cindy Price, Julia Cox, Debbie Hamm and OPEN (Council Representative), Pastor Parish Relations Committee; Nancy Karlson and Cindy Price, Memorial Committee.

There was no Old Business.

**New Business:** Jerry Hamm said that the Lion's Club will be moving their meetings back to the church. They would like to put up flags, a banner, plaques, etc. It was discussed that it would be fine to put up these items but since there are many groups that meet at the church, they might want to put their stuff away after each meeting.

Julia reminded everyone that Pastor Gary's final sermon will be February 28 and there will be a potluck following. She welcomed Anne to our church and said we are looking forward to her time with us.

There was no further business.

Pastor Gary led us in singing the Doxology to close.

The meeting adjourned at 2:00 pm

Following is information about the 2016 calendar year for Collbran Congregational Church UCC, regarding membership and activities:

#### CHURCH MEMBERSHIP:

- We have 23 members who are active in our church.
- An average of <u>20</u> people attended church each week, during the past year.
- Many friends went to be with our Lord, this year, from our church and community: Delbert Lowell Koehn, John Litton, Ben Hayes, Leona Margarite Gibson, Guillermo Enriquez, Betty Walck, Jerry Hamm, Verl Charlesworth, David Bowen, Isabel Lucas, Nada Djokic, Charles Clifford Stanton, Louis McKey, Larry Price, Clifford Hill, Marlin Etcheverry, Anna Lopez, and Velma McDaniel Marek. The Women's Fellowship provided meals for many of these memorial services.
- There were no births among our members.
- There were no baptisms or dedications.
- There was one marriage in our church this year- Melissa Lynn Redding and Chad Wayne Hopkins were married by Pastor Anne Djokic on August 20th.

#### CHURCH ACTIVITIES:

- Pastor Gary Bryant served as part-time minister for January and part of February. He retired in February. Pastor Anne Djokic has been here since February and we are so thankful for her time and all the activities she has taken part in as well as the many visits she makes to those who are sick or who cannot attend church. Thank you Anne! You have made a big impact on folks in our community. Your love for people and life show in your actions.
- On September 18, 2016, we had a "Welcome Celebration" with Pastor Anne Djokic- to welcome her here, as our Pastor. 55 people attended this special service.
- Sue Bellotti, Cindy Price and Edith Ann Power have continued putting together the monthly "Mustard Seed" to send out news about our church to those who cannot attend. It is a good reminder of upcoming activities.
- Collbran Congregational Church held a fun and well-attended Vacation Bible School June 22-24 (thanks to Sue Bellotti and Edith Ann Power and many others!). 25 -35 children attended the three days of activity and fun. An exciting Sunday Service featured the kids after VBS ended.
- The Children's Sunday School students have learned many good things from the Bible this past year and have sung for the congregation several times. Sue Bellotti and Edith Ann Power continue to lead the students in learning about Jesus. 2-10 children have attended during the past year. Since several older children are in attendance, a second class will be started in the future.
- The Adult Bible Study has not been able to meet this year.

- Women's Fellowship hosted the annual Senior Tea on May 3rd. About 80 people attended and had a very fun afternoon. There were 18 Plateau Valley High School graduates and 10 Job Corps graduates along with some family and faculty. Magician Dave Wallin always has a great show for the attendees.
- Women's Fellowship prepared and provided for Church potlucks and gatherings, for many mission projects, for the annual luncheon with Grand Junction UCC, and for the Turkey Dinner. They provide meals for memorial services and many more invaluable gifts to the community.

- Sue Bellotti scheduled and set up the annual Christmas Recital on December 4th. Several children and many adults provided beautiful music and readings to remind everyone about Baby Jesus and God's amazing love for us.

#### TREASURER'S REPORT 2016

The Collbran Congregational Church, UCC, successfully met the bills, salary, and maintenance expenses of 2016.

Some additional expenses were incurred with larger repair and maintenance projects at the church and parsonage. Doors have been replaced or repaired, furnaces checked and evaluated, and general care of the buildings and grounds have taken place.

The December 31, 2016 balance in the UCFund Investment account is \$93601.56. With the strong stock market this past year the investment fund has grown giving us investment income of \$11710.06 over the year, helping recover some of the cost of the roof job in 2015.

We will continue to be prudent with the management of the funds received from each of you, who so generously and consistently support this church. In-kind donations continue to help keep our spending for everything from office supplies, cleaning supplies, paper goods, and craft materials in check.

I thank each of you for your financial support and your time and energy. It is the people that make the church. The building is simply the place we meet.

#### COLLBRAN CONGREGATIONAL CHURCH, UCC TRUSTEE 2016 ANNUAL REPORT

Trustees have recommended and overseen several repairs and preventive measures over the past year.

- Gutter and soffit repair to the west midsection roof due to ice and snow damage.
- Parsonage door lites replaced due to fractured glass
- Tree removal in Mothers' Park overgrown and scrubby trees viewed as unsafe and unsightly in the park.
- Dining Room south door repaired and refit to the door opening.
- Dining Room north door and frame were replaced due to unsatisfactory structure and workability from age.
- Gymnasium ceiling lights changed to LED lights when some were no longer working and required replacement. After studying the success and expected longevity and decreased running expense of LED lights, the LEDs were chosen.
- Toilet water supply valves (all 4 toilets) replaced due to irreparable leakages.
- The church boiler passed its annual inspection.
- The parsonage furnace was inspected and found to need the zone valve replaced for the west wall of the living room.
- A thermocouple was replaced in the parsonage furnace.
- The hot water heater at the parsonage will need to be replaced soon, due to corrosion of the drain.
- The water softener at the parsonage was cleaned, and disabled for the time being due to inactivity at the parsonage.

At the time of this writing (January, 2017), we are awaiting information and bids for replacement of dining room heaters. The west heater has stopped working from age, leaving the dining room too cold for comfort for meetings and dining experiences. The east heater is the same age and will likely stop working soon. Replacement of both is considered to be the most frugal action at this time. Electric plug in heaters have been used as temporary measures, and are considered expensive, unsafe and inadequate for long term use.

In addition to the above, Trustees have overseen the custodial care, lawn and sidewalk maintenance (year-round) for both church and parsonage. Thanks to Becky Schowalter and Delbert Koehn for providing these services, always with care and respect. Thank you!

The budget is limited, and because of the generosity of community members and church attendees, the repairs are made and the expenses are partially covered by extra donations and memorial contributions. As noted elsewhere, it requires many to keep the doors of the aging church open.
